OUR ARMS FOR SERVICE:

DESIGN SECTION:

• Artists drawn from the best talent available in art schools and Design colleges are constantly engaged in preparing paper designs. These designs comprise both for weaving and for hand block orscreen printing. The attempt is to preserve traditional designs by reviving them and/oradopting them to the requirements of the market. These designs help in production of itemsboth for domestic and export markets. This Centre has 'Arahne' Software for making designs forSaree,Dress Materials Home Furnishing and Wall Hanging Design(Photo Image on Fabric)etc., Care is taken to see that the designs developed are within the discipline imposed by the types of yarn, dye stuffs and weaving techniques as per requirements of the sector. This core service is rendered from Weaver's Service Centre, I.I.H.T Campus, Thillainagar, Salem.

WEAVING SECTION:

• Skilled weavers drawn from the main traditional weaving communities of the country tothe Weaving Section in WSC, Salem. They are supervised by qualified textile technologists. Facilities ofprototype looms and weaving equipments are available in the Section. Fabrics in new designs and new textures are produced using different yarns. The Section hasElectronic Jacquard working with solar power and motorised lifting devices for easy weaving. This Centrealso undertakes simpleimprovements in looms and in the processes of weaving. Innovative handlooms& accessories developed by others from the industry are also installed in the section or create awareness among visitors to this Centre.Attempts are being made to produce Technical Textiles on handloom by modifying existing loom.Modified Stainless Steel Sample loom has been developed by this Centre for imparting on-Loom finishing during the weaving process. This core services is rendered from Weaver's Service Centre, I.I.H.T Campus, Thillainagar, Salem.

DYEING LABORATORY:

• Fully equipped Dye Laboratory manned by qualified technical personnel capable of developing yarn &cloth dyeing techniques in processing are available in WSC Salem. These Laboratories bring out number of shade cards for silk and cotton dyeing. These illustrate a number of shades in use in the field of handlooms and also givedetails of the method of application of dye stuffs, temperatures to be maintained and thelength of dyeing period for each shade. These cards also provide information on degumming, scouring, bleaching, dyeing etc. and the equipments used in dyeing and testingmethods. This core services is rendered from Weaver's Service Centre, I.I.H.T Campus, Thillainagar, Salem.

PRINTING SECTION:

• This Section carries out experiments in preparation of basic materials for hand blockprinting &Screen Printing.Dischargeable and non-dischargeable dye stuffs have been effectively used to obtainmultiple effects of rare beauty. Sizeable quantity of hand-block and screenare available for use by Weavers and Handloom organizations.

LIBRARY & DOCUMENTATION SECTION:

• A collection of cloth samples, books and periodicals dealingwith various aspects of the textile industry is available in this Section. In an attempt toaugment the resources of the WSC, there is a proposal to acquire a sizeable collection ofbooks and periodicals to form a bigLibrary of the Weaver's Service Centre, I.I.H.T Campus, Thillainagar, Salem.

OUR CHARTER OF SERVICES:

DESIGN DEVELOPMENT:

• Innovate and develop designs, motifs, patterns and prints, via in-house skills, on areregular/on-going basis, through appropriate systems and trained designers and synchronization ftraditional designs, etc., with modern and contemporary design. For this purposed evelopment of In-house designs undertaken based on:

(a) Specific demand from the market in terms of apex societies, weavers cooperatives, institutions, exporters, manufacturers or private persons.

(b) As per the demand of the International market in terms of colour, design and fashionforecast.

(c) Revival of market-worthy traditional motifs.

(d) Designerscreate designs from various sources e.g. Museums, Temples, Palaces Havelis /HousesState/National Archives Private Collectors College of Arts/crafts Caves, Book of Art & craft&Handicrafts(carvings,wood,metal,stone,ivory,etc.,)
Corporations/Associations/Guilds/Journals Manuscripts miniature Paintings/ Antique

furniture/Potteries/Tombs /Seriesof Art & Industry Collections /Cataloguing Books e.g. Sir Fort Watsons collection, symbols and portrayals of festivals, and mythologies World-wide. Utmost care is taken to assess itsmarket - worthiness. Help of CATD is taken to perfect the colour and design combination and suitability of fabrics.

• Maintain and update an inventory/ data bank / warehouse of designs, motifs, patterns, prints, etc. and display developed samples in Display Hall / Exhibitions.

• Popularise increasing adaptation and adoption of designs, etc., as a vital ingredient of valueaddedproduct development/diversification and for the creation and sustenance of a culture of quality.

• Encourage the sale of designs, prints, etc., on a non-exclusive right basis.

• Weavers' Service Centre is linked with the National Centre for Textile Design in order toprovide information to weavers in terms of fast changing consumer preferences, fashiontrends and technological developments in the means of communication both within andoutside the country. Weavers Service Centre online activities with NCTD and subsequentlywith weavers relates to the provision and analysis of trends and forecasts of colour andfabrics for the fashion and home fashion industry keeping in mind the requirements of theentire sector such as colour forecasts with regional preferences, forecasts of fibre blends, weaves, fabric structure, motifs and print idea for printed fabrics. WSC has linkages withExport Promotion Councils, State Handloom Agencies having Design Centres, Apex TradeBodies both inside and outside the country and related linkages to textile resource sites. It hasdata base of reputed handloom manufacturers, fibre suppliers, spinners and yarn makers, machinery and fashion accessories suppliers, garment manufacturer etc. The offline activity of the WSC in consultation with NCTD involve fabric collection, cataloguing according toregion, locality, to maintain a Museum of Heritage Textile of the region and locality havingcollection of motifs in the form of line drawing CATD design, swatches and samples.

TRAINING:

• Weavers Service Centreimparts training through various existing Schemesto semi-skilled and skilled weaversin weaving for product development, product diversification and improvement in productivity. Training also imparted in dyeing& printing techniques and designdevelopment on looms for the beneficiaries within the jurisdiction of Weaver's Service Centre, Salem.

• Short term in-house training in weaving, designing/pattern making and processing tostudents, weavers, master trainers, employees of State Handloom Corporations, Apex Bodiesand others provided in Weaver's Service Centre, I.I.H.T Campus, Thillainagar, Salem.

• Weavers Service Centreimpart training through SAMARTH Scheme which is 'Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector (SCBTS)'to promote skill upgradation in the traditional sectors of handlooms.

EXHIBITION:

• In-house product display of the latest and unique samples, samples drawn on the basis of revival of traditional motifs, display of improvised and modern looms and their working. Through its in-house exhibition, the members of WSC acquaint the visitors with the latest information required for the development of right fabric in right colour and for right market. The information on woven and selected designs by the visitor is provided with complete technical specifications like count of yarn, EPI & PPI, technical graph for jacquards, the weaving procedure to enable them to produce quality and design enrich fabrics having greatermarket acceptability. The same idea is taken out door also.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT:

• R&D work is carried out for loom development, design modification, development of shadecards, natural dyes, unique sample development, and is available at reasonable prices inWSC. Extension services are provided through training programmes or at very reasonablecharges.

• To look into the usability, manufacture and improvement of materials used in the handloomindustry and other trades or industries allowed therewith including designing, dyeing, bleaching, finishing, printing and chemical stores, etc.

• To assess the utilization of the products of the handloom industry as well as to assistmembers in the execution of sample orders.

• To do in house work for the improvement of various machinery and appliances used by thehandloom industry and other trades or industries.

• To investigate into and help improvement of various processes of manufacture with a viewto securing greater efficiency, rationalization and reduction of costs.

MARKET SUPPORT:

• It provides marketing guidance in coordination with State and Central Government, e.g.,nominating and forwarding societies/master weavers for participation in DilliHaat, SurajKundMela, TajMahotsav, Udaipur, Shilparamam- Hyderabad, Patiyalautsav, Craft Melaetc.

• Provides support in e-marketing like GeM (Government e Marketing Portal) and India handmade Portal. Conducts Workshop for creating awareness, helps in registering Handloom Cooperative Societies, individual weavers, and handloom entrepreneurs.

PROMOTION OF EXCELLENCE:

• Recommends, Weavers, Designers and Handloom Marketing people for contribution outstanding in handloom production for National Award to be presented by the President of India.

BRANDING & PROMOTION

•India Handloom Brand launched by O/o DC Handlooms, Ministry of Textiles, is promoted by creating awareness among public. Registrations are done by collecting samples and sending it for testing at Textiles Committee, Mumbai and carrying out on-site verification & surveillance.

• On-site verifications are also done for Handloom Mark registration.

•Geographical Indication act is being implemented to preserve the traditional handloom varieties of a geographical location and also protects from duplicity of the authentic handloom variety.

• Periodic Powerloom inspections are being carried out to check for any violation of the Handloom Reservation Act.

•Also helps in protecting the languishing handloom crafts by means of revival / reformation of handloom products.

•Promotional activities on government ideologies are being carried out like Swachata activities for Clean India and also on digital payments methods for Digital India.

HELP AND GUIDANCE:

• A complaint / grievance box shall be placed which may be used to drop a written complaint/grievance. The box will be opened and checked daily for contents(s), if any.

• A Bunkar Mitra Helpline number is being announced by Government of India for providing technical assistance to the Handloom weavers in relation to raw material supply, availing credit facility, Quality Control, access to market linkage and information to various schemes & procedure to avail benefits.

• Common Facility Centres are being constructed in various Block Level Clusters for the benefit of the handloom weavers of the locality for their pre and post loom activities.

• Common Service Centres are being located in WSCs and in various places as the access point for delivery of essential public utility services.

• A complaint / grievance will be promptly acknowledged and requisite action taken and communicated within 30 working days of receipt.

• If for valid reason(s) a complaint / grievance cannot be redressed within the due time, a suitable interim intimation will be sent promptly.

• All efforts will be made to locally and satisfactory redress grievances. However, if a complaint / grievance has not been attended to promptly or satisfactorily, at the local level, the matter may be considered to be taken up in writing with the following functionaries;
